Speaker Biographical Sketches

Richard L. Drake (b.25 February 1950), Director of Anatomy and Professor of Surgery Cleveland Clinic Lerner College of Medicine of CWRU, is known as a teacher, educational researcher, author and leader. A master teacher, he has awards from students, institutions, and the American Association of Anatomists (AAA) receiving the 2011 Henry Gray/Elsevier Distinguished Educator Award. An accomplished researcher, he gives talks on educational topics at national and international meetings, and has published numerous peer-reviewed papers and book chapters. He was appointed a fellow of the AAA in 2009. He is one of the authors of *Gray's Anatomy for Students*, *Gray's Basic Anatomy*, *Gray's Atlas of Anatomy* and *Gray's Anatomy for Students Flash Cards*. His current leadership roles include Secretary/Treasurer of AAA, Treasurer of the International Federation of Associations of Anatomists, President-elect of the Association of Anatomy, Cell Biology and Neurobiology Chairpersons, and Co-Editor-in-Chief of *Anatomical Sciences Education*.

Wayne Vogl (b.29 November 1951), Professor of Cellular and Physiological Sciences in the Faculty of Medicine at the University of British Columbia, has made life long contributions to medical education. He has continuously been involved in teaching gross anatomy to medical, dental and undergraduate students, and has been actively involved with curriculum development. He has been a lecturer in Gross Anatomy since his appointment at UBC in 1981, directed the Gross Anatomy Program at UBC from 1992 to 2002, and from 2004 to 2008. He received the Teaching Excellence Award seven times from the UBC Medical Undergraduate Society, the Basmajian/Williams and Wilkins Award from the American Association of Anatomists in 1988, the University Teaching Prize from the University of British Columbia in 1992, the Killam Teaching Prize in 2006, and the J.C.B. Grant Senior Scientist Award for teaching and research in 2006. He was appointed Fellow of the American Association of Anatomists in 2009. He is co-author of "Gray's Anatomy for Students", *Gray's Atlas of Anatomy*, *Gray's Basic Anatomy*, *Dorland's Gray's Pocket Atlas of Anatomy*, and *Gray's Anatomy for Student's Flash Cards*. His research is in the area of epithelial remodeling events in the mammalian testis and he has published over 100 peer-reviewed journal articles.
